In the precious name of Jesus we greet you,

It has been a very busy year ministering from ME to FL to Utah & Idaho and many places in between. The Lord willing, I will get caught up on my normal chronological writings of where I have been and what we have all done this year in my December Newsletter.

In this 10 year anniversary letter I have prepared a special look back across the life of the mission, some accomplishments, and our 10th Anniversary Fund drive information. It also includes Gabrielle and the Yohes newsletters. To God be All the Glory for the many things done.

Wow, its been 10 years since God's call to start this mission work was ringing in my ears. I can still remember it like it was yesterday. God led me to close my business, trust Him by faith and be active in full-time ministry. It was the first week of November 2006 that I answered that call. Those first few days held much uncertainty of what all God was calling me to do and how I would live.

Here is an excerpt (in blue) from a book I am writing that explains many things on how and why the mission was formed.

## God's Leading to start a new mission work

God gloriously saved me from a multitude of sins and changed my future forever. I was saved on November 5, 1999 out of a life of drugs and alcohol. On November 7, 1999, God called me to the ministry. During the first two months of my call, I struggled to imagine that He would want me to minister for Him. After all, I was just a computer technician with poor skills in reading and writing and an ex-drug addict and alcoholic. I prayed frequently to be sure that this was God's will for my life. On December 21, 1999, God brought the scripture reference Deuteronomy 18:5 to my mind. Having never read this particular verse before, I turned in my Bible and read: *"For the LORD thy God hath chosen him out of all thy tribes, to stand to minister in the name of the LORD, him and his sons for ever."* My heart burned within me as I settled the question that God called me into His ministry. I then set my course to mind God and started Bible College part-time at Penn View Bible Institute in February 2000, where I studied Pastoral Ministries until the spring of 2004.

Over the next 7 years, from the time that I was saved, God has led me to pastor two churches and to do a lot of personal evangelism. In the spring of 2000, I started a computer consulting and service business that I operated from my home. When I left the Academic Computing Manager's position at Bloomsburg University to start pastoring, this business turned out to be one of my main means of financial support. I ran this personal business from 2000 until 2006 when God led me to shut down the business to concentrate on ministry full-time while trusting Him entirely by faith for my provisions. I struggled greatly to know for certain if this was the will of God, but in the providence and timing of God's omnipotent hand, His will was fully revealed to me.

As God would have it, we started a revival meeting at the end of October in 2006. During this revival meeting, God clearly made His will known to me: I was to shut down the business and concentrate on winning souls. I did not know what all this would mean. It seemed so impossible. How would I live? I needed the income from working to make it in this hard world, but yet the call was crystal clear. Many people thought I was off my rocker to even think of stepping out into such a deep ocean of water. I would receive advice from good Godly people to not give up my business and don't do anything sudden, but it was too late I had already begun the process of closing my business which was burning bridges that I could never return to. This was a dying out process for me to mind God over men and follow His leading at any cost.

If you want a scary feeling, try training your replacement when you know there is no turning back now. I started training other technicians to take over my corporate computer service customers whose office PCs, file servers, and networks I managed. It was very hard and I went through some difficult trials. By November 27, 2006 I had performed my last business service call and fully closed my business. Now what?

A few days after answering the call to close my business and concentrate on full time ministry, I remembered talking to Rev. Tom Kiser from New York City about visiting him sometime and ministering on the street. I now felt such a compelling burden from God that this was the time to make the ministry trip to NYC. So off I went.

Bro. Kiser, whom I had only met a few times at Bus Convention and Penns Creek Campmeeting, was so receptive to me. He spent the first day that I was in NYC giving me some training on how to do street ministry and introduced me to Prayer Station ministry. As I sat through his training, I found myself weeping over the countless millions in the cities of the USA. I spent the whole next day out on the streets of NYC at prayer stations. It was amazing to see the openings the Prayer Stations made to witness to people. We were able to lead people to Christ right on the street. That was it; the hook was set in my jaw. God was now reeling me in. I flopped over and over a few times until I finally set my course for God's shore of street evangelism. When I left NYC after just

two days, I told Bro. Kiser, "I don't know if I should go home, maybe I should stay and help you." Bro. Kiser told me that I should go home and pray and see what God wants me to do in my area.

Over the next week or so after returning from NYC, I spent much time trying to sort out whether or not God wanted me to move there and help the Kisers. But as God's leading continued to be manifested, I soon found His clear leading to start in my own back yard. I started studying up on the nearby cities of Allentown, Bethlehem, and Easton. I found that the population of the Lehigh Valley area, which includes these cities and more, was overwhelming in itself. The Lehigh Valley Area is Pennsylvania's third largest per capita area, next only to Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. There are approximately 1.5 million people within a 30 mile radius of the airport which was only a few miles from my house.

I began to digest the statistics and the leading of God. I started scouting out the cities and the street-walking traffic. I conversed with Bro Kiser and then also with Bro. Dirus Dustin from Indiana who runs an independent ministry called "Free Indeed Ministries, Inc." God continued to lead me in how to structure this mission work similar to how a missionary would function. I presented the idea to Rev. Jacob Martin, at that time our Home Missions director, and Rev. Harry Plank, at that time our conference president. It was suggested that I give things a trial run with a borrowed Prayer Station.

In early December I spent some time on the streets with a borrowed Prayer Station and saw great results. (some pictured above) A backslider prayed through on the streets, the totally lost were in tears and calling out to God, a young lady seeking Holiness met me (a Holiness preacher) and became a temporary helper and Spanish translator for me. (pictured above—Theresa.) Her full story will be in a later chapter. Even a heroin addict came to the end of himself and sought God the night before I met him, then I gave him a ride to a nearby city which I will share more about in a later chapter. God was working and the fire for street evangelism was burning brighter in my heart each day. The fire could not be quenched. It was on my mind night and day. The zeal of the Lord was burning deep in my soul.

In exploring the possibility of structuring a mission work based on evangelizing souls abroad, I made sample prayer cards like most missionaries use for deputation, started showing them to people, and interviewed them about their thoughts for this new kind of mission work where I would operate as a missionary to the streets. The feedback was very positive, and many statistics were gathered. A meeting was scheduled for Dec.18, 2006 with the Home Missions board to present the new leading of God for my life and the results of the survey I conducted. At the meeting, God helped to convey the burden of my heart to the board members as I shared anointed testimonies from the few experiences with the prayer station.

One of the fleeces I put out before the Lord was that if it was God's will for me to do this mission work that He would have someone send in \$500.00 to our Home Missions department designated for the mission work. This would show the board and I that it was God's will. One thing we need to realize is that by asking God this, I was asking God to have someone send \$500 for a ministry that did not actually exist yet. I felt such an assurance that God was going to answer this prayer that I almost called Rev. Clough, our H.M. treasurer at that time, to see if the money had come in yet, but instead I waited. Well, it did come in. In fact, it must have come in within a day or two after I prayed at the beginning of December. Now, with our meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup>, few knew the money was there before I spoke. I didn't know it came in until after the board meeting. God showed his will but kept it from me so I would continue to trust Him by faith as I presented my research, survey results, and testimonies to the Home Missions board. God is all wise!

In a phone call following the Home Mission Board meeting, Bro. Martin informed me that they had enough votes for me to operate as a missionary under the Home Missions department, but the work would only be funded by the money I was able to raise for support. So on December 18, 2006 the mission work was official. All Glory to God. Bro. Martin suggested I start visiting our churches for mission deputation and gave advice on how to proceed. I had not thought of doing deputation as a missionary before this. My first mission service was not until January, but during this interim time God had amazingly provided for my living even though only a few knew that I was living completely by faith now. Money started coming in, even at times by people who didn't know what was going on in my life. In December, I received somewhere around \$1,300. I had closed my business in November, and God started providing for me as I minded Him.

God gave me this verse while I was reading a testimony about a missionary in China: *Psalms 37:3 "Trust in the LORD, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed."* Oh, that God would help us all to trust Him fully! Are you called and worried that God will provide or help you to live? Do you believe God's word?

Praise God! Understand that God most often works through our jobs or a channel where people can fund missionaries, and then there are the times he does the miraculous. He is worthy of Praise no matter how he provides.

In the early days of our mission work, I ..... to know the rest of the story, you will have get the book when available.

I plan to continue writing this exciting book. Lord willing, it will include many fantastic stories through the years including souls saved, encounters on the streets, miracles of provisions and healing, as well as the persecution and resistance we have experienced inside and out of the church. Hope to have more info on the book in future newsletters. Pray for me to get this accomplished this Nov-Jan.

**April 2010** Because of the busyness of our treasurer Home Missions appoints our own treasurer separated from department

**May 2011** God confirmed the call to leave the Northampton pastorate and go full-time doing missionary work across the USA.  
**July 2011** Mission work established headquarters at a building in Mifflinburg, PA with dedicated office  
**Aug. 2011** Started Travelling the USA in minivan  
**Feb. 2012** Start travelling in motorhome towing minivan  
**April 2012** Official name of Keister's Evangelism Mission was approved by the Home Missions' board as the mission work grew to be far more than just street evangelism. As it expanded to help churches all over the country, the non-denominational representation of "Evangelism Mission" summarized very well our focus of evangelism as a mission help to multitudes of church organizations.  
**May 2012** God leads to create other mission housing areas in our building by a mighty answer to prayer for a whole kitchen to be delivered... (read it all in our May 2012 newsletter on our website.)  
**July 2014** 1st missionaries to stay in building (Greg Davis family)  
**Feb. 2015** Nathan Yohe joins for a 2 yr. term, May 2015-2017 as Missionary Evangelist, Admin. Assistant and Treasurer

**Jan. 2016** Gabrielle Keister joins as Missionary Evangelist

God has done so many wonderful things and it is He who deserves all the Glory for what is accomplished. As I think of sharing the things He has done across the last 10 years, it is very humbling

and miraculous that He could take such a broken person and do these things. Praise to God.

I do not want to just paint a picture of everything good as there have been attacks of Satan in many ways through the years. I have made mistakes and had to apologize. I have been harassed by police on the streets, Satanists, Black Hebrew Israelites, and religious people of many kind. While there have been numerous times that I have seen God provide in answer to prayer, there have also been many occasions where I had to borrow money to get through. God has always brought us through our situations and has never left us stranded, hungry, or out of gas. He has always come through some how.

#### 10 Year Anniversary Fund Drive.

Will you join us? Each of our missionaries have an annual budget to raise. In the Yohe's and Gabrielle's portions of this newsletter the progress of their annual budget is outlined. I also will share my present support and expense needs.

I estimate it will take another \$10,000 to finish out this year. This \$10,000 would consist of being reimbursed for my mission related expenses, pay healthcare expenses allowances, all the mission office expenses, my remaining housing expenses, a few projects I'll mention below, and hoping to get close to receiving my salary for the year. I have spent these 10 years just squeaking by and often receiving only about half of my permitted salary. With me trying to purchase the building next year, it is important that I close out 2016 with close to my set salary for the first time ever in the history of the mission.

I have covered Nathan's housing expenses for nearly all of 2015 and a portion of 2016 through my mission support, hence shorting my compensation and raising expenses over the last 1.5 years. We praise God, he has finally been able to build up some support in 2016. Supporting him out of my mission support has left me hurting greatly at times. This is not a complaint but rather an explanation of how things have gone and a request for prayer. We praise God for the provisions that have come through for his support so far this year and are trusting God that it will continue. If we can raise the remaining part of his estimated support for this year it will help greatly. He still needs to raise around \$4100 to meet his housing and expenses. It would even be better if we could raise \$4500 so he can receive not only full reimbursement for his mileage expenses and meet housing expenses, but that he could get cash salary yet this year. Nathan is only part-time and at present he is not receiving a cash salary from the mission, just a housing allowance that covers his living space and utilities. Though he does receive a salary for his position as Pastor at Danville GMC, as well as housing at our Mission headquarters, December would be a great time to topple over the \$4100 remaining support needed and give him a well-deserved cash salary from the Mission yet this year.

#### Tracts and Newsletters Production Project

At the end of this letter you will see an announcement of our tracts that we are mass producing to spread the Gospel. We had to get a new copier/printer to produce our newsletters and regular mission printing. This is a lease copier that cost \$140 a month plus a small fee per printed page. It is more economical than outsourcing our printing needs and will save us money. We have produced tracts on our old copier mainly for our use, but now that we have the industrial fast printing machine, we can produce tracts economically to make available to the public. In order to do this the most cost effective way, we could use a higher quality paper cutter that would cut large quantities of tracts, as the one we have is not working too well. Also, our folding machine is on its way out. To replace both our paper cutter and paper folder, both used for tract and newsletter projects, the equipment will cost use around \$1600-2000. Producing tracts has the potential to help pay for our copier lease payment and raise support for Nathan and future workers by creating income from the tracts. So this tract production can help to build support for this part of our mission work. Please prayerfully consider giving for this project. #### Street Equipment Project

Another Project I am launching is to purchase some new street ministry equipment. It would include a portable sound system with wireless mic, a video camera or two with wireless mic(s), and two (2-3 step) ladders used for elevated preaching on the streets. This equipment would enable us to more adequately do street preaching in multiple places with one set travelling with me on mission trips and another set of equipment for use here in PA by Nathan and volunteers. It is important to video for protection from false accusations of people (police and others) that may try to challenge our free speech rights and so we can post our news videos. Please visit our You-Tube channel "Evangelism Mission" or our website to watch some that have already been recorded. The total cost of this project is estimated at \$1,000—\$1,500. The USA needs the Gospel spread on city streets, rural areas, and college campuses from state to state. I don't know any other mission work that is attempting to take on this challenge. If you want to see your nation come back to God, we must advance the Gospel even more. With your help we want to continued to proclaim the Gospel from East to West and North to South across this great land. The Lord willing, 2017 will be the year we reach a goal of proclaiming the gospel in all 48 continental states! Will you help us accomplish this goal?

This summer has been full of excitement and learning opportunities! I traveled with my dad for the majority of the summer helping him do mission work across the States. The past few months, God has really helped me to step out of my comfort zone, although it's still a work in progress.

In July, we went to Wichita, KS to join in an event hosted by Operation Save America. Each day during the event, groups go to abortion clinics and protest abortion. At night time they have a church service. It's sort of like a camp meeting, only with evangelism.

I know abortion is wrong and that it's murder, therefore making it a sin. However, I wasn't sure how I felt about abortion protesting. I've seen people profess Christ's name and His love, and then act in such hate toward those who need the saving power of our loving, merciful Savior while protesting abortion (such as the group I mentioned in our June 2016 newsletter). It seems people preach the sickness, but not the remedy.

God began to open my eyes to the need of this type of ministry – even if it was something way out of my comfort zone. The first day, I was shocked with how embarrassed I was to be protesting abortion. After all, how is this making me look? I assumed people driving by would categorize me as a bigoted Christian, inconsiderate of the circumstances bringing someone to go through with an abortion. I had mentally placed myself in that group, and Satan really used that to limit how God could have used me. Throughout the day, God began showing me how wrong my attitude was. He has called some people to protest abortion, and He is using it to save physical and eternal lives.

The people of Operation Save America have a real love for those considering abortion. There are so many babies being killed before they're even born, and we sit around and let it happen. Those who are contemplating abortion need to hear Christ's love. God helped me to see that the mothers who feel like abortion is their only choice, need His love. They're already hurting. They already feel alone. They are already broken, waiting for the healing balm of God's love, mercy, and forgiveness to be applied to their lives. Unfortunately, it is too often that they have not even heard of such love, mercy, and forgiveness. It's my prayer that God would help us all to catch and intensify a vision for the lost in our hearts, myself included!



This semester, I have tentatively scheduled to be in downtown Indianapolis each Friday night to do ministry, and each Monday I plan to go to Indiana University - Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI). Each week may be different depending on weather and other circumstances. Since I'm at Union Bible College, each time I go to do outreach, I avail the opportunity to the students as well. UBC's mission department and I have also teamed up for outreach; some of them are pictured above. Last time we went downtown, I had a group of 10 people come with me (pictured below), including myself. God has been using this to help me step out of my comfort zone by leading and teaching those who have never done something like this before. It's a really humbling experience! I feel inadequate to be leading and teaching others how to witness to people. Please pray that God would give me wisdom, along with more boldness on the streets.

While at IUPUI in August (below left), I met a student named Tony. Tony and I talked for around 15 minutes about religion. He's currently Roman Catholic, but sees the flaws in the religion and he knows it's not the right one to be following. He wants to leave Catholicism, and is considering other religions. He seemed to be hungry for truth. Please pray that God would use the encounter I had with Tony to speak to him, convict him of his sin, find the Truth, and have a changed life!



Also pray for a young Muslim girl who was given a tract downtown by one of UBC's students, Caitlyn Smith. The young Muslim girl who was given a tract, took the tract against her father's wishes. Caitlyn said the girl's father was trying to take the tract from her, but she resisted and kept the tract. Pray that God would continuously speak to her about following Christ. People of the Muslim faith are very devoted to Islam, making it ex-

tremely hard for them to leave it. This young girl really needs prayer. God could even use her to bring her whole family to Christ. Pray that God places Christians constantly in her path to point her way to Him.

August 14, the Sunday evening before I drove back to Westfield, IN for college, I spoke for my first deputation service. I was extremely nervous about speaking for my first time. Once I got up behind the pulpit and began to speak, the nervousness decreased after a few minutes. I cannot praise God enough for how He helped me in that service! Through this experience, God taught me that whatever He plans for me, He'll give me the strength to accomplish it.

One of the needs that I expressed in my deputation service, was a financial need. Without this being met, I wouldn't have been able to return to Union Bible College the following morning. It's so amazing how God brought in every penny that was needed for me to return to college! He even brought in enough to cover my first semester of books and pay part of August's payment. Although college support is still needed, along with personal support, God has been so great and I can't praise Him enough! Every need I have had, He has supplied in one way or another!

Joining Evangelism Mission back in January has been a huge step of faith for me. It's so easy to trust God for other people's needs, but much different when you have to trust Him for your own. The past 10 years since God called my dad to live entirely by faith, I have seen God work in absolute miraculous ways. I've seen God answer prayer time and time again. God has even fulfilled some of my personal wants. He is truly amazing, and He is more than faithful to meet our needs! He is a wonderful Father! As Jesus says in Matthew 7:11, God is much more capable of giving things to His children than man is. There's just one qualifier, we must ask Him! Of course God doesn't always give us all of our desires, but He definitely always gives us exactly what we need, and what is best for us, even if we do not see it in the moment. He is so faithful and trustworthy!

#### Note from Rodney Keister

I want to thank all those who have prayed for and supported my daughter as one of our missionaries over the last 10 months. It has been a large help to her and our family budget as she begins to raise her own support working for the Lord. While she is working hard for the Lord in our mission work, she is also doing some student work hours to help with her college tuition.

As a part-time missionary with us, she is up to \$60 of regular consistent monthly support and with all the spontaneous contributions through 2016 her support total so far this year is approximately \$1,645 resulting in an average \$164.50/mo. Please pray she can raise the remaining monthly support to meet her mission needs which is an estimate at \$800/mo, giving her a salary of \$400 per month and \$400 of mission work expense to supply her travel expenses, gospel tracts, and her portion of newsletters and miscellaneous mission expenses.

We also have much to praise God for in this calendar year as her supporters have given \$3,021 since January 2016 toward her college fund. Praise the Lord! We praise God for all that has been accomplished thus far. While we have come a long way since January, as of November 1st, her total due on past and present college tuition is \$7,479. And with the present policies at UBC, in order for Gabrielle to be able to return to UBC for the spring semester in January she must raise a minimum of \$3,699 by her registration day in January.

Is God speaking to you about being one of her regular monthly supporters or a college fund supporter? If so, please let us know. We are fully trusting God will meet all the needs to keep her working for the Lord in His called mission field and in college till she graduates. Perhaps there are some churches that would open the door for her to hold mission deputation services. **The Pennsylvania Report by Nathan & Anna Yohe**

Dear Family of God,

We have been staying very busy between office work and outreach in the Pennsylvania area. On August 2nd, Anna and I were privileged to help Pastor Andrew Grate and the Parkville Bible Church with an evening community outreach. About five minutes from their church, the town of Goldsboro, PA participated in National Community Night Out. The church gave out free cold sodas which gave us an excellent opportunity to distribute the, "It's the Real Thing" Gospel tract. This tract features a soda slogan (and tells about how to be a Real Christian) and we found that people were very receptive to taking it since they were also receiving a free soda. We had a good conversation with a gentleman who was an Italian Catholic. He explained that his faith was different from the typical Roman Catholic Church, and that he believed in salvation through faith in Christ and not by works. He had brought his step-daughter who is wheelchair-bound and struggles with some physical and mental handicaps due to a disease that had attacked her body. He shared that she seems to be showing some small developmental improvements. We were able to pray with them and he seemed to be encouraged by the prayer and fellowship.



On August 11th and 12th we were able to minister at MusikFest in Bethlehem, PA along with Bro. Rodney Keister, Gabrielle Keister, Bro. David Wise, Luke & Paul Hughes, and Nathaniel Morley. We were

amazed by the wicked, satanic spectacles that took place in the streets of this festival, and were thankful for the opportunity to have several good conversations. Nathan had a conversation with a man who claimed to be a Christian but who did not have a church, and so he tried to direct him to a good church in the area. Anna, along with Bro. Wise, talked to a young man who knew that he was going to hell, and yet claimed that this fact did not bother him. We pray for this young man's salvation.



On September 2nd, we did a late night outreach on the streets in Bloomsburg, PA along with Bro. Keister, Bro. Wise, and Bro. Billy Miller.

The wickedness of sin is very apparent on these streets filled with drunken college students. We were able to have several good conversations that evening and Anna exchanged phone numbers with one young lady in order to keep in contact with her. This young lady seemed very interested in the Gospel and yet had a very difficult time with surrendering her will to the Savior. Please pray for her salvation and that the Lord will be able to use us to reach her.

On September 15th Nathan went with Bro. Keister and Bro. Wise to Harrisburg for a daytime outreach. Franklin Graham was there speaking on the Capitol steps with his "Decision America" event. We were happy to be a part of that gathering and afterwards we ministered on the streets near a busy bus station.

September 23rd we went with Bro. Wise, Billy Miller, and Brad Fultz to the streets nearby Penn State University for a late night outreach. We were able to distribute a great number of tracts and to hold some meaningful conversations. We look forward to a busy schedule of day and night outreaches the remainder of this fall and winter and pray that the Lord will prepare hearts before us.

Unfortunately we are unable to write about all of the occasions on which we go out to do street and campus evangelism. 
**Note from Rodney Keister**


