stranger to street ministry and God also greatly used him to help reach the lost. The meetings closed out with wonderful encounters, anointed

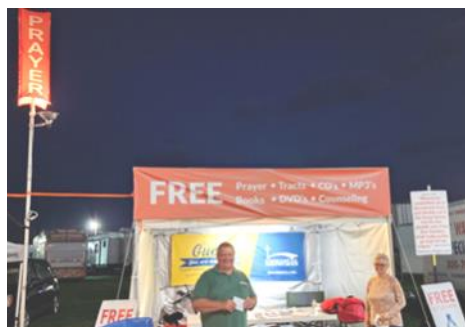
preaching and singing that changed lives. Two people had planned to commit suicide this last day we were there, but God use the ministry to change their minds. One man prayed clear through and was remarkably
