## Keister's Chronicles July 2015 - Dec. 2015

### July

After leaving Sioux City, IA, we travelled to Urbana, IL. The next day (in our car) we traveled to pick up Nathan Yohe at Union Bible College in Westfield, IN where he stayed for the night after driving in from PA the day before. Nathan was doing part of his summer internship with our mission work, learning more about what we do on the streets. After picking up Nathan in Westfield, IN, he, Gabrielle, and I got to tour a new, unsanctioned, Mormon Temple in Carmel, Indiana. Being able to see and have explained to us by a guide some of what they do in the temple was quite a learning experience. This helped us see more errors of their ways and learn how to better witness to them. We had planed to do some street ministry in Indianapolis, but the rain kept us from our desire. So, we went to a mall and handed out some tracts very tactfully. The next day Nathan and I worked on more of his accounting training in QuickBooks as he was still learning how the mission does its accounting.

Faith Church in Urbana holds a Founders Week series much like a traditional revival meeting. We were able to visit their opening day of meetings on Sunday and then take part in Youth Congress 2015 (Great Commission Camp) on Monday. YC2015 was scheduled to take place in the Indianapolis area, but because of some complications it had to be moved to Urbana-Champaign IL and was combined with their Founders Week. While the schedule of events was very condensed, God was still at work with the youth attending from many places. I spoke in one of the youth training sessions and taught a lesson on soul winning. Then we did door to door evangelism and prayer stand ministry with the youth. I truly love mentoring young people to win souls. Praise the Lord for all the souls that were influenced with the Gospel.

From Urbana, IL we made our return trip home to PA and were able to attend our annual Conference of God's Missionary Church. It was nice to be in my home area even though I never got to sleep in my home bed as we were parked at the Penns Creek camp the whole 11 days home in PA. It was nice to have a break from the normal crowded schedule of preaching and street ministry. Thank the Lord for the good campmeeting and for the souls that sought the Lord. While I was able to attend a good portion of the camp services, I had some health issues again which I will address in an article "Health & Healing." We also thank the Lord for the mission deputation service we had at York God's Missionary Church.

### August

Following the conclusion of Penns Creek camp, I left on Monday for Logansport, IN to preach a tent meeting. While there for the week to preach, we did frequent door to door evangelism on the



streets near the tent. Josh Heyer also travelled with me and assisted in the evangelism efforts on the streets. God placed a unique burden on my heart to setup our street preaching sound system outside the tent and all the preaching services were broadcasted through the nearby blocks. Surprisingly we got no complaints or trouble from the police. The meetings could be heard for over two blocks away. The Gospel penetrated the hearts of those setting on their porches as well as those who were walking by. Josh did an awesome job walking around the tent during service and distributing Gospel tracts to people who were passing by on the streets. At times some of these people even stopped to attend the service. Pray for strengthening of all the seekers during the tent meeting.

From Logansport, IN, Josh and I travelled to Union Bible College for him to start school. I parked at UBC for a few days and Gabrielle arrived to move into the dorms and start college. What a joy it was to see her following God's call for her life. Gabrielle has grown so much. Be sure to read her portion of this newsletter. It is so exciting to see what God is doing in her life and in the lives of those she ministers to on the streets.

While in Indiana we were privileged to hold some deputation services. We are so grateful for the funds raised at the at Dunkirk Friends Church, the Calvary Bible Wesleyan Church in Plainfield (video is on their website archives Aug. 19, 2015), and the Pilgrim Holiness Church in New Castle.

In August we also, did a small church evangelism help with the Early Methodist Church in Carthage, IN. There we did some evangelism training services and some special evangelistic services at the church on the weekend to reach out to people in their town. We spent time canvassing the community, sharing Jesus with them at their doors, and inviting them to the services. We are grateful for the hungry hearts that attended and minded God.

I finished up the last week of August helping the New Castle Pilgrim Holiness Church with door to door evangelism, evangelism training, and then on Sunday preached the morning and evening services. While at New Castle, one of the most exciting things that took place was meeting a man while knocking on doors. He was not the kind you would think of having much interest in God, but he requested prayer that his faith would be restored. After praying for him, I invited him to come to church in the morning where I would be telling my testimony of how God brought me out of deep sin. He promised to be there and showed up for the morning service. He and his girlfriend both went to the altar to pray. During the prayer time he stood up and said "Halleluiah the Rock is Gone!" Then came to me and gave me a big hug and said, "Thank you for knocking on my door." He was aglow. Within a few days, Bro. Raines was able to spend time trying to disciple him. He has had many struggles and continues to need your prayer.



### September

September came quickly, and before leaving Indiana, I was privileged to preach in the Union Bible College chapel. From Westfield, IN, I travelled home to PA. In PA I held mission deputation services at the following churches: Emanuel Wesleyan Church in Gratz, House of Prayer in Millmont, and the Evangelical Methodist Church in Forest Hill. We are so thankful for each church who hosted us and members of the congregations that attended. Thank you for your interest, prayers, and financial contributions to this mission work. To God Be All the Glory!

We evangelized during our annual event at the Nittany Antique Tractor show. There we worked with the God's Missionary Church in Penns Valley to create a collaborative evangelism effort. We also setup our Evangelism Booth at the Beaver Community Fair in Beaver Springs (pictured). We are thankful for all those who helped with these events. Thousands of gospel tracts, many sermon CD/DVDs, and Bibles were distributed between these two events. We prayed with a large number of people too.



I also helped the God's Missionary Church in Lebanon, PA

evangelize the streets and distribute Bibles to homes. They have a goal to see that every family in Lebanon receives a good quality bible. What a vision for the lost! I preached through my testimony in their Sunday morning adult chapel service. We also preached the "Too Many Master's" living allegory sermon with Baby the Dog twice in their family life center. Once for a banquet where the bus ministry families were invited and once for their church youth service. Thank the Lord for those who sought the Lord.

Please pray for Baby The Dog, as her days to continue ministry may be approaching retirement in the near future. Pray God would continue to touch Baby. To my amazement, God has already led over 100 seekers to a place of prayer through her living allegory sermons across the USA these 6 years she has been ministering.

September concluded with my annual visit at a Home Mission Board meeting where I gave the God's Missionary Home Mission board an update on our mission work and shared the vision God has placed on my heart to see a work in Utah. At this time I am planning to make visits to Utah and see how God leads. Looks like it may take a multi-church denominational effort to launch a work in Utah. Pray God would lead the right lay people and ministers to labor at an independent or interdenominational work in Utah. We shall see the providence of the Lord fulfilled only as those He is speaking to rise to the occasion to win the lost at any cost! Who will Go?

## October

Off we went back to Indiana. This time to setup a table at UBC Fall Festival. There we represented the mission and met lots of UBC Alumni for the first time. I had a brief, projected power point presentation setup in the big tent with many other vendors. There I showed interested people and pastors a quick glimpse of what we do to help churches. This led to an open door in which we were able to help a small church in Lima, OH during a week that I had open in my schedule. God sure knows how to lead me.

Also while at UBC I was invited to teach a session in their Intercessory Prayer and Evangelism class. I did a detailed power point presentation about soul winning and testimonies of intercessory prayer answered. God helped so greatly and I am invited back again to share in a few more classes in the fall of 2016. Pray as we plan out those classes. Not only did I teach in the class but we also took students out on the streets and at IUPUI (pictured). Following this time at UBC, I went on to Lima, OH.



In Lima, we held a series of meetings teaching evangelism and preaching messages to the community around the Pilgrim Lighthouse Chapel. We also did door to door evangelism and a street meeting where I did some open air preaching. One of the neat things that inspired me was a young lady named Jordan. Every day that we spoke at the church or did door to door or street ministry, she was sure to be right there to help. She always showed up in pink, so I nicknamed her Pinky Jordan. She was so zealous to evangelize lost souls. Here she is pictured in action on the street. Pray for Pinky Jordon, as I wonder if she has a calling to fulfill! Pray also for the seekers and the many we evangelized that week in Lima.



After Lima, I went to God's Bible School in Cincinnati. I have had an open invitation, for several years now, to be a guest teacher in Dr. Mark Bird's class on evangelism, but it seemed when ever I was passing near GBS, our schedules just could not match. So it was great that this year it fit just right. In the class, I taught the same lesson which I did at UBC. (Unfortunately, I had to leave out the intercessory prayer testimonies as it was a shorter class period.) We also had a small group of GBS students join me on the streets for Prayer Stand Evangelism.

From Cincinnati, I went on to Circleville for their annual Pumpkin Show event. There we teamed up with Pastor Elijah DeMint of People's Faith Chapel to evangelize the show attendees. We handed out thousands of tracts, and setup the prayer stand again this year. Here is a family that received Bibles and tracts. Elijah also help inspect and seal the motorhome roof, and I finished the side seams when I got home in November.



The Lord also opened the door to teach in a chapel service at Allegheny Wesleyan Bible College in Salem, OH. I taught the same soul winning class I had taught at GBS and UBC. I also had an op-

portunity to share my mission presentation with Bro. Cope the Allegheny Wesleyan Methodist Church Connection president. Due to illness passing through the college the week before I arrived (and many still recovering) only one young man, Bro. Richard Geul from FL (pictured,) was able to go with me to do some campus ministry in Akron. Pray for the souls we ministered to Akron.

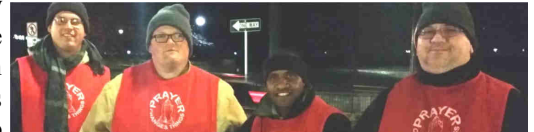


In October we also held mission deputation services at the Friends Church in Westfield, IN; the Church of God in Knightstown, IN; and at Peoples Faith Chapel in Circleville, OH. Thank you congregations for your faithful help to our mission work. While at the Church of God in Knightstown, IN, I also taught a Sunday School lesson on Soul Winning and preached a Sunday AM service. It was nice to see hungry hearts for the Word of God.

## November/December

For November and December I was off the road and in my home for a change. But little rest for the weary, as I had much work to do on the house and motorhome. The motorhome needed some more maintenance. I rebuilt the dysfunctional front furnace finally, after living mainly with electric heat out front for months. There were some other minor repairs done that I don't remember all the details. I also spent time working on more of the finishing work with our remodeling at the house.

In November, I spoke in a chapel service at Penn View Bible Institute in Penns Creek, PA. There I preached a challenge to the students to win souls and shared slides from things in our mission work. I also did a training session in a Christian Service chapel, where I shared the same soul winning lesson I did at UBC, GBS, and AWC. We also evangelized a few times on the streets at Bloomsburg University and Penn State University with Penn View students (pictured). I also



praise God for an amazing encounter where a PSU student got saved. After praying, Jenifer (pictured below) told me that she never comes up this street and always goes another way, but this night she just felt she should take this street. Well, what do you know, there



"just happened" to be two preachers there and a convicting conversation opened up which resulted in tears flowing, prayer ascending up to Heaven's throne room, and a soul being changed by the amazing Lord Jesus.

I was privileged to hold mission deputation services at the God's Missionary Churches in Newport, Milesburg, and Penns Valley, PA. Thank you for your many blessings to the mission work. I also enjoyed a Christmas dinner gathering with our home mission board members and fellow home mission pastors. Thank you GMC HM for a nice time out at Hoss's Steak House.

December also started our office work for end of year receipts, income reports, and a newsletter publication. This took over a month of time and wrapped well into January.

## Health & Healing

As I began to tell you in my Keister's Chronicles, unfortunately while at Penns Creek Camp I fell sick with heart complications again. My heart was missing beats frequently and I was very weak. After a lot of rest it returned to a mostly normal condition and by the time the doctor had me wear a heart monitor, they only found a 1 % abnormal heart beat. So what made my heart beat improper all of a sudden and now be mostly normal?

My local doctor wanted me to see a specialist to find out what was going on, but I was leaving for my next mission trip to Indiana and would need to have tests run out there. So I went to a doctor friend of mine in Indiana, he said he knew cardiac care well and knew what test to run. So off I went to have a nuclear medicine stress test. Praise God there were no blockages or serious problems found, but now I was back to square one, what was happening with my heart? Back in July the missing beats were very real, my pulse

would literally stop a few beats at times, and then I would get light headed with chest pain, but all seemed back to normal until in late December through early January

With all the year end office work and January trip preparation, I started having spells where I would get light headed and feel like I was going to pass out. On one occasion I had to stop in the middle of a grocery store while shopping, ride the electric cart out and have my assistant, Nathan, pick me up and take me to the ER. I could not walk without nearly passing out. It turned out that sleep deprivation, coupled with stress, was causing all these problems with my heart and near fainting spells.

So I praise the Lord for healing through rest. I learned of a supplement called melatonin that I now take at night which helps me to get more rest and not wake up or have trouble falling asleep. I have been doing rather well as long as I get a sufficient amount of sleep. Through this experience, I sure learned that I am not 20 years old any more and I can't run on a few hours sleep when in a pinch. Please pray that I get proper sleep, and get all these medical bills paid off through Christian Healthcare Ministries.

One of my difficulties with lack of sleep is that my burden for the lost is so great I run myself ragged working long hours at times. Both in July, when the heart problems surfaced again, and in January there were nights with little sleep when I was trying to reach my next destination or trying to get mission year-end reports accomplished while preparing to leave for another trip. I desperately need a full time assistant on the road and another one at the office instead of just a part time assistant. Please pray and spread the word that we need more missionaries to help carry this load! I am looking for a few good men to help our mission work reach the lost of this world!

Please pray for my hip and back as something happen on Sat. to my hip joint and lower back and now something is out of alignment.

## 2015 Yr End Fund Drive Results & Present Needs:

We praise God for all that was accomplished in our 2015 End of Year fund drive. We were trying to raise \$14,100 to take care of current and lingering expenses. Thank the Lord most of this goal was met by the \$9,517 raised by Dec. 31, 2015. More fund drive donations were also received early in January. So Praise the Lord, we were able to get reimbursed for all the old motorhome repairs on a family credit card. We wiped out the old propane bill of \$2048, the utility bills, as well as many current mission operating expenses, and a portion of my healthcare expenses. From Jan. to present we have been blessed to continue this work of the Lord as God provides by faith. Thank you to each of you who helped so much and for each who prayed but were unable to help.

As I mentioned in the 2015 Year End fund drive letter, we were going to try something new to keep you all informed better by keeping the fund drive web page updated monthly. This was a trial experience and lasted until early March. We found it is not possible with my travels and Nathan not having website design experience to continue this fund drive portion of our website.

### Current Financial Projects

There is approximately \$1700 needed to pay off our Winter/Spring propane and utility expenses, around \$1000 of mission ongoing expenses, and approx. \$1000 of travel reimbursements. There are some health care bills that are not covered under CHM healthcare coverage which I would love to see come out of payment plans and be paid off. The mission pays for my healthcare coverage and there are presently \$600 due to pay before they will pay my recent hospital and doctors bills. Pray about these current needs and if you are able to help with them we would be so blessed to see all these needs taken care of.

### The Pennsylvania Report by Nathan Yohe

Dear Family of God,

I have been staying busy with office work which includes entering new newsletter addresses and updates, checking the mission mail on a regular basis, recording donations and expenses, printing tracts and supplies as well as working with CD orders. If any of you are interested in volunteering by burning / shipping CDs and stuffing newsletters just let us know. There is plenty of work to be done here. This is all stuff that needs done on a regular basis in order to enable the work of God through tract distribution, travelling evangelism, etc.

While Bro. Keister is on longer trips, I continue the local evangelism, which he started, by organizing evangelism trips to Bloomsburg University and Penn State University. Bro. Billy Miller (a Penn View Bible Institute Ministerial student) and Bro. David Wise (God's Missionary Church Pastor in Berwick) have participated frequently in these evangelism outreaches. Other PVBI students who came out on the streets to help during this past school year included Shane Walters, Simon Kuman, Zach Clevenger, Nathaniel Sisson, Justice Maylee, and Christian Claycomb.

One encounter we had was with a young man (a college student in BU) that feels guilty for not believing in God and wants to be convinced that there is a God. Pray that we will continue to have opportunities to witness to him, and that God will give us the words to say in speaking with him. Most of all pray that God will make him sick of sin and willing to repent in order to be saved. These efforts are effective in reaching people with the Gospel as well as giving those who minister a deeper desire to reach the lost for Christ.

Recently, a group of us went to Harrisburg to do street evangelism. As you probably know from former newsletters, Bro. Keister has been doing an increasing amount of street preaching. On this particular trip he planned to preach and the rest of us planned to pass out tracts. After he had finished preaching one of the times, he gave Bro. Billy Miller (center in photo) an opportunity as well. He preached about the fact of being free from chains of sin. This was his first time to street preach and he felt that God helped him.

This type of work helps you to step outside of your comfort zone and helps to increase a burden for the lost.

Later that same day, Bro Keister also offered me the opportunity to preach. The ironic part of the story is that, moments before, I

had told Derek, a man from my church (left in photo), that I did not think I was the street-preaching type. Bro. Keister encouraged me to find a verse and speak as God leads. As I thought about what to preach, I believe God led me to the idea of "The wages of sin" (Rom. 6:23). I was nervous, as I had no notes with me but my New Testament. I soon learned, however, that as you rest in the power of the Holy Spirit and trust in Him, He brings the right thoughts to mind. It was unlike anything I have experienced before. I was not necessarily "prepared", but God still used it. Praise His name! Later that same day, I spoke about the "Peace of God" (Phil. 4:7) {which was successfully videoed}. Since that time I have had another opportunity to preach there. I praise God for the lessons that He taught me about depending on Him through these instances! Check out our videos of Harrisburg Street preaching on our website and YouTube channel.

Bro. Keister would like to get another set of video equipment which would include a camera to record with and portable sound system. This would enable us to be do street preaching, even when he is on a mission trip in another state. It is important to video for protection from false accusations by police and other people who may try to challenge our free speech rights to proclaim the Gospel. The total cost of this project is estimated at \$1,000 - \$1,500. Pray that the Lord gives us wisdom and supply the needs of His work. This mission work is sustained by faith, prayer, and support of the Family of God.

Anna and I recently graduated from PVBI (Anna with a BA in Music Education and Nathan with a BA in Ministerial Studies) and are eagerly looking forward to our wedding which is fast approaching: June 11th. She will then be able to help with various aspects of the work here like stuffing newsletters, evangelizing on the streets, and, of course, providing wonderful meals. We share the great desire to save souls from the bondage of Satan and we look forward to seeing where that vision will lead in the future.

## The Heartland Herald, By Gabrielle Keister

Since joining the mission as an adult in January, God has blessed in so many ways. Before giving an update on what God has been doing through me, I would like to thank those who have supported me: prayerfully and financially. Words cannot express my gratitude.

Over the past two semesters at Union Bible College (UBC), I have gone down to Indianapolis for ministry many times. Unfortunately space does not allow me to tell of all the times.

My mind draws me to the image of a sweet homeless man, Bill, who I met this past December. We talked for nearly 45 minutes on the streets of Indianapolis. He was heading to the mall to stay warm, so I accompanied him on his walk there. It broke my heart, but even angered me, to hear Bill tell of a church right on Monument Circle in downtown Indianapolis. Every Sunday morning this church provides a sack lunch, consisting of a sandwich with a few other snacks for the homeless people in the city. However, the church makes all of the homeless men and women leave before any of their parishioners arrive for the Sunday Morning service. They do not want their congregation bothered by the homeless people. How sad to think that a church could become so calloused to the need of others' salvation that they would turn them away simply because of their current social status! It was so tragic to hear of this story. I praise God for how He helped in the time Bill and I had together. Our talk started with prayer and ended with a scheduled visit the following week for me to bring a Bible to him. I'm sad to say that I have not seen Bill since he received the Bible. Many homeless people die without anyone noticing or caring, including emergency service personnel; please keep Bill in your prayers.

Back in April, a few students from UBC's mission department went to downtown Indianapolis with me for street outreach and to set up the prayer stand. Much to our surprise – their fear, and my excitement – we drove past what appeared to be a pro-choice protest in the lawn of Indiana's state house. You can see the crowd in my banner picture at the top of this letter. Seeing such an opportunity, I immediately began to



look for a place to park and set up the prayer stand.

By the time we parked and walked the block and a half to get to the Indiana State House, about half of the protestors had left. We set up the prayer stand on the side walk rather than the lawn of the State House where everyone else was. We heard a lot of yelling and screaming coming from a group of the protestors and some anti-protestors. There was a Christian man with a mega phone speaking against abortion. He was with a group that were very harsh and bold in their approach. They had signs implying that God hated the



abortionists. God does hate the hands that shed innocent blood according to Proverbs 6:17, but this approach often does more harm than good. While revealing sin is necessary for conviction, it is the goodness of God that leads people to repentance. So we try to show love while leading people to truth.

I walked over to the argument that was taking place and began to ask what was going on, and started sharing some tracts with the protestors. As we were sharing with the others in the lawn, a few people asked if I was with the other group that was there. Once I said no, they kindly took the tract. People thanked me for my loving approach and were shockingly receptive.

As the protest drew to a close, God placed it on my heart to talk to the lady who appeared to be in charge of the protest. I had seen this lady run up the steps of the State House yelling and screaming at Erin, a lady part of the anti-protest group. She stood in front of Erin blocking her sign and refuting every word that came out of Erin's mouth. There were a few times I thought the lady was going to beat up Erin. I was honestly a little frightened by her, but I knew God wanted me to approach her.

The lady was at the corner of the street preparing to cross. I walked up to her, handed her a tract, and said what I knew God wanted me to say: "I just want to let you know that not all Christians are the same. I'm a Christian, and I love you." I'd never been more scared to talk to someone in my whole life. Her response shocked me. She said, "I love you too, and maybe if more Christians were loving like Jesus, I would consider being a Christian instead of worshipping the Universe." She was halfway across the intersection by the time she finished talking. I praise God that the lady next to her, dressed in all black, asked me for a tract before she walked across the street.

It's been said before, but is still true: you draw more flies with honey than you do with vinegar. I pray that God would always help me to show Christ's love to others. I pray that we as a Christian people would look beyond all of the pre-fixed ideas we have in our minds. Look beyond one's apparel. Look beyond one's social beliefs. Look beyond one's religious beliefs. Look beyond one's sexual orientation. This doesn't mean that we accept their sin, it means that we look beyond everything and see people how they truly are: a soul bound for either Heaven or Hell. We need to see people as Jesus sees them. Take for instance the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus went against all social norms as a Jew when He talked to her. His love for her soul went beyond everything He should have thought, enabling him to see her soul. I pray that God would help us to love as He does.
